Covid-19: I'm the kind of person that believes he can overcome any illness or obstacle that is thrown his way. I suppose a lot of that mindset comes from my upbringing in South Carolina and probably from the training and application of the tough assignments we had in the Army. Everyone in the 101st believes he is one of the "tough guys" that can do anything; I'm sure you feel that way too. In my comments in the Fall 2020 edition, I was feeling confident that the vaccines being developed by at least three manufacturers would soon eliminate the corona-virus that has placed us in a state of suspense this past year. As we prepare to go to press with the Winter/Spring 2021 edition, I must tell you that I, and my wife, tested positive on January 4, 2021. I thought it was going to be like the flu or a winter cold that many of us suffer each year. It had a lot of similar symptoms but I also had chills and fevers that lasted about three days, and there was the coughing, aching and weakness, and no desire to do much of anything. We quarantined as suggested and after the fourteen days, we retested, it was negative again on January 18. We both received the first Pfizer vaccine on Saturday, January 30 from a local hospital. Since then we've only suffered a sore spot on the arm where the needle went in. I'm surprised that VA hasn't called. To date, I've heard nothing about being vaccinated at the VA Center that's only 40 miles away. I hope everyone is having better luck in getting tested and vaccinated. We did finally get the second vaccination and had a few symptoms afterward. My wife said I had "Brain Fog" but that's been an ongoing problem for me. I think I'm just getting too old and a bit lazy. Her diagnosis sounds better, so I'll use that.

Reunion 2021: It's a fact that Covid-19 is of great concern, not only for our health but for the reunion we have planned in Branson, MO. One day the news suggests that once we are vaccinated, all should begin to get better. Then, the next day they tell us about another virus strain from the UK, and yet another from South Africa. Apparently, the safest thing to do, wear your mask, wash your hands, social distance from others, get the vaccine, when and where it's available. I want to keep a positive attitude as I'm looking forward to seeing Branson in August. The Radisson Hotel staff is prepared and ready for our arrival. This hotel has a full time restaurant, bar and swimming pool. To make things even more exciting, we have arranged for a late afternoon cruise on a real paddle-wheeler, the Branson Belle, that also features a floor show and dinner. This is a two hour trip that begins at 4 PM. We will provide bus transportation from the hotel and back at the conclusion of the trip. All of the Officers of the organization will be taking this trip and we encourage everyone to join us. This event will be on Thursday, August 26, 2021. Update from our Reunion Committee Chair, Ed Barbour

I was, along with everyone else, very disappointed that we and higher authorities cancelled our Aug. 2020 reunion due to the COVID pandemic. I hope our next reunion in Branson will be a go. I, Dave Nesbitt, and others are planning the Branson reunion for Aug. 25-29 and we need the help of all attendees. Branson is a place that has the highest regard for veterans that have served our nation. The Radisson Hotel exhibits the "Hall of Honor". However, there are no nearby military facilities, but it is an area of great entertainment groups and individuals. But more importantly, we have a chance to commemorate our past on a one-to-one personal basis.

I have suggested that we get a group of at least 50 or more to go on Thursday at the 4pm to the Showboat paddle-wheeler (The Branson Belle) for a cruise that offers dinner and a show that lasts 2 hours, then take the bus back to "the Strip" to the show starring the Presleys at 7:30pm. The Presleys are a musical family group of all ages that have been playing there for the past 53 years. They were the originals in Branson. When I previewed Branson last year, I saw both shows and it was a blast. However, when I called the Presleys for this year, they were off during the time we will be there. Therefore, I suggest the Haygoods who will have a show on Thursday August 26th at 7:30 pm. I was told that they would honor and recognize the 101st as a group at the show. I believe Branson will be sending out a whole list of entertainment options to attend at other times during your stay.

The other matter we need to consider is getting there. Most airlines come into the Springfield Airport (SGF) which is about an hour away. The drive is easy. Most people going to Branson rent a car because there are so many events to see and it would be good if you have the option of going to events on your own. Also, if friends can get together and share a vehicle and coordinate airline schedules, that would be an option. Branson has a regional airport (BKG) phone (417-334-7813) you also can check out, but it seems to be tentative. The Branson Airport is only 1.4 miles from the Radisson Hotel. Airlines that service Springfield to Branson are Allegiant, American, Delta Connection, Northwest Air-link, and United Express, however in this Covid environment, we had better check out the availability of these airlines in and out of Branson. Branson Airport also rents cars by Enterprise, National, and Alamo. You can call the Springfield Airport (417-869-1031) for availability of airlines to Branson.

For you golfers, there are about ten courses in the area. The Tiger Woods course called Payne's Valley (417-339-5420) is a 72-par course.

Dear Friends,

On January 13, 2021, Representative Gus Bilirakis (FL) introduced H.R. 303, the Retired Pay Restoration Act.

This bill would extend concurrent receipt authority to longevity retirees with service-connected disabilities rated 40 percent or less. Under current law disabled veterans with longevity retirement from active military service who are also in receipt of a Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) disability determination of 50% or higher may retain both military retirement pay and their compensation.

DAV strongly supports H.R. 303 as it would end the unfair policy of forcing many military longevity retirees to forfeit some of their retired pay in order to receive equal amounts of disability compensation from the VA. This legislation is in accord with DAV Resolution No. 002 and would eliminate concurrent receipt for all longevity retirees.

Please use the prepared letter or draft your own to urge your Representative to support and cosponsor H.R. 303. As always, we appreciate your support for DAV and thank you for participating in DAV CAN.

101st Airborne Division Vietnam Veterans 27th ANNUAL REUNIONAUGUST 25-29, 2021 BRANSON, MISSOURI**



Our reunion for 2021 will be held in Branson, MO during the period of August 25-29. Reunion headquarters will be at the Radisson Hotel, conveniently located where there's plenty of entertainment for our guests. Branson is famous for it's veteran friendly atmosphere and events.

The hotel is located at 120 South Wildwood Drive, Branson, MO 65616. Our special reunion room rate is \$92.95 plus taxes per night for a double, queen or king room. The price includes two hot buffet breakfasts each morning. We have set aside 50 rooms each night and requested that a good number of handicapped rooms be available for our guests. If you require handicapped facilities, it is suggested that you call the hotel directly to ensure you get the accommodations you need. If you encounter any problems with your reservation, contact Dave Nesbitt at 803-491-4186. Also, be aware that the special room rate will be available two days prior to the reunion start up date and for two days after the close of the reunion.

If that doesn't work for you, it will be on our Facebook page, which is at 101st Airborne Division Vietnam Veterans or by calling the hotel at 417-335-5767. The link will also be added to our website, www.101namveteran.com. This link will allow you to make reservations online with the reunion information already entered for our group. You just need to insert your arrival and departure dates and select the room you desire. They will also require a major credit card number. If you call the hotel, be sure to tell them you are with the 101st Airborne Veterans group so that you will be shown in the block of rooms we reserved for the reunion. **The cut-off date to reserve rooms at our special rate is June 25, 2021.** After that date reservations will be based on hotel availability. The Branson area is really busy during the Summer months so book early. If for any reason you make reservations and have to cancel, the hotel will release you from the reservation if you notify them at least 24 hours in advance of your planned arrival date.

The Branson Regional Airport (BKG) is nearby but it has limited flights and no airport shuttle service. I learned that Frontier Air flies in to Branson. If you plan to fly, we suggest you go in to Springfield Airport (SGF) and rent an auto and make the 45 minute drive on a four-lane highway to Branson. When Ed Barbour, Reunion Chairman, conducted recon on this site, he flew in to Springfield, MO and found that renting a car was the best way to reach his destination. There are many other attractions located in the city, go online to: www.ExploreBranson.com. They will send you a free Visitors Guide.

As is always the case, the Reunion Registration and the Hotel Registration are two separate items so be sure you register early for both. There is a Reunion Registration Form in this newsletter on page 6 that should be completed and returned to the 101st Secretary with your registration fee in the near future. A Famous Man by Keith Nightingale

Brothers, INCOMING has been generously given permission to feature this story about a brave 101st Brother who gave the last full measure. As with other Food Service Specialists when I looked him up on the Virtual Wall I was aghast to see no CIB indicated for him. When I checked HonorStates.org it indicated that he had been properly recognized with the award. Checking further I was more than overjoyed to find out that three other similarly situated Brothers in the 101st that I had been advocating for had indeed, likewise, been awarded the Combat Infantry Badge

From mess cook to machine gunner, he quietly did his job, ignoring the taunts of soldiers he saved.

"Famous" is a common word with many applications. It can refer to a person, event, place or thing. Or it can simply be the name of someone who exemplifies all of that. Such a man was Pfc. Famous Lee Lane of Poplar Bluff, Mo. Famous became truly famous on April 20, 1966, in Binh Thuan province, South Vietnam.

His name is inscribed on Panel 06E, Row 124 of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall. But that is not why he was – and is – famous to those of us who knew him.

I was first introduced to Famous Lane when I joined the 2-505/82nd Airborne in 1965.

Famous was a cook in the battalion mess. The unit deployed to the Dominican Republic as part of Operation Power Pack, and Famous first became famous there. Headquarters and Headquarters Company (HHC) Mess had several .50 cal's as part of its MTOE (Modification Table of Organization and Equipment). The weapon simply outweighed many in the mess, so Famous naturally assumed responsibility for its care, cleaning and use.

Famous was known at this time as a quiet, large man with an infectious smile. He seldom spoke but just went on with his work and that of others, without fanfare. He was the ultimate silent soldier in an organization where the voices and noises of combat were constant conditions.

Within a day after deployment, Famous took his .50 cal to the rooftop of the recently captured building occupied by HHC, 2-505. Soon, several aircraft of the rebel Dom Rep forces proceeded to strafe the troops. On the roof with Famous was a staff sergeant named Engle, of the anti-tank platoon. Engle was an ex-Wehrmacht soldier who had joined the 505 as a pathway to U.S. citizenship when the regiment was stationed in Germany.

Engle informed Famous that the planes were not going to hit them; he had significant experience against U.S. aircraft from previous combat experience. And if you could see wings wider than the leading edge, the bullets would pass beyond.

Famous then stood behind the .50 and engaged the aircraft with an experienced bird hunter's lead. One of the two aircraft was quickly hit, began burning and crashed. The other plane fled.

The rest of that deployment was pretty uneventful for Famous. But, within the 2-505, Famous became more and more famous for his successful shootdown of an enemy aircraft. That, however, did not change his demeanor or work ethic in any way.

At a later time, while we were both at Fort Bragg, I asked him with the usual naïve ignorance of a second lieutenant, "Why did your mother name you Famous?"

He looked at me and said in a quiet, patient voice, "She thought that would help me out." End of discussion. Soon, Famous left the 82nd and joined the leading elements of the 101st Airborne Division, now deployed to Vietnam.

Assigned to the mess again, as his stated military specialty, Famous found there was no real mess in deployed field units. Instead, he went to his NCO and asked to be assigned to a machine gun with the infantry.

The NCO took him to the HHC commander, who then asked his friend, the commanding officer of A/2-502, if he could use a large man who wanted to be a machine gunner. The assignment was made.

Famous joined the unit and quickly stood out for three primary reasons:

- He wanted to be there, when he could have stayed in the rear.
- He towered over most of the infantry.
- He was very focused and never complained; in fact, he rarely spoke. He just carried his weapon and did his job.

Few really knew him. He didn't converse much with others. And there were few fellow Black soldiers in his unit, predominantly composed of whites from the Deep South with prejudices and characteristics commonly associated with that environment at the time. (They were also the core of the life professionals and thoroughly competent in their work.)

Within the group, two young soldiers took it upon themselves to occasionally make fun of Famous or to ridicule him with others. Famous, fully aware, said nothing and went about his work.

On a hot April morning, Company A found itself looking across a large green rice paddy toward a brushy jungled area just beyond. Suddenly, shots rang out, and the troops went into immediate battle drill, dropping behind the dikes and returning fire. Gunships and artillery began to work the brush-hidden enemy positions. Famous quickly had his M60 working in support.

Suddenly he stopped firing, raised up from his position and looked to his direct front at two crumpled soldiers – two young troops who had often slighted him. This day, they were walking point and had triggered the initial confrontation. Both were wounded and lying on the open paddy, truly in no man's land. Famous could clearly see who they were – and how they were.

Without guidance or an order, Famous jumped up and began running straight to the pair, through continuous fire. He reached them and grabbed each under an arm – as if they were footballs – and began running back to the friendly position.

His size had alerted the enemy. He was a big, conspicuous target. And his machine gun, unmanned, was of no use.

As Famous made his final sprint into friendly lines with the two wounded men, he was hit by several bullets and killed on the spot. For this action, Famous Lee Lane was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross.

I will always remember him for being who and what he was, the truest definition of Famous, who needed no one's help to make an eternal name for himself.
